Mission Statement

To save lives one net at a time.

We are dedicated to preserving life and giving hope. In a place where difficult challenges are met everyday, we are committed in helping to heal those in need through dedicated hard work and passion.





The IndyWIN Committee has held a collection drive for the Indiana Women's Prison for several years. We recently delivered our yearly donations and were given our yearly tour showing ongoing projects the women are involved in. The volume of items made is impressive and the quality is excellent. The project leader over the craft areas was an inmate who was very informative and articulate. She is a published author and upon release plans to complete her work towards a Ph.D.

Mosquito Nets Project: The women make mosquito nets which are sent to foreign countries where mosquito borne illnesses are prevalent. Their nets are larger than most nets made available in these much needed areas of the world. One net can cover a mother and a couple of small children. They have provided around 1500 nets so far. This particular project requires financial donations made to purchase the netting and batting to construct the nets. Community Service Projects: The Indiana Women's Prison has well equipped arts and crafts areas that are dedicated to community service projects. They make quilts. afghans, hats, mittens and scarves for the homeless, retirement communities, and for Life Centers and Children's homes. They make book bags and stuffed toys for children and sleeping bags containing many items needed by the homeless. There are a host of other craft projects they are involved in, as well. Ongoing needs you can donate include: Materials for quilting, yarn for knitting, plastic knitting needles, stitch witchery tape, thread, etc. These items can be dropped off at the Greater Indianapolis NAACP Branch #3053 Office in the Julia Carson Government Center, 300 East Fall Creek Parkway North, Indianapolis, IN for the continuing IndyWIN Collection Drive. We were also allowed to visit this special unit:

Wee Ones Unit: This is an innovative program in the state of Indiana. If a woman delivers her baby while incarcerated, and sentenced to less than 18 months for a non-violent offense, she may be eligible for this program that allows her to keep her baby with her throughout her incarceration. This unit is separate from the regular prison population and may house up to 10 mothers with their babies. Ongoing needs include: diapers, wipes, and all things "baby", including clothes, toys, blankets, towels and washcloths, hygiene, etc. These items can also be brought to the NAACP office. Please indicate on box or bag that it's for the Women's Prison.

Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States. From its Galveston, Texas origin in 1865, the observance of June 19th as the African American Emancipation Day has spread across the United States and beyond.

Since this was a observance of a historical African American event, the IndWIN Committee provided Juneteenth attendees with brochures containing information on the 100 year histories and accomplishments of the national NAACP organization and our Indianapolis NAACP branch.
